Free Tax Return Preparation

In 2019, the AARP Tax Aide Foundation will offer Tax Return preparation and counseling at the Carson City Senior Center at no fee to the taxpayer. Trained and certified volunteer tax preparers will conduct this FREE service on Mondays and Wednesdays beginning Monday, February 4, 2019 through Wednesday, April 10, 2019. The hours of service will be from noon to 4 p.m. and will be available to all seniors and taxpayers with low to middle income. Special attention is given to individuals 60 years of age and older. Note, if the taxpayer or any member of the taxpayer's household purchased health insurance through the Nevada Health Link or the federal HealthCare.gov site, the taxpayer must bring all forms 1095-A to his/her appointment. Taxpayers are also required to present valid government photo IDs and Social Security cards.

Appointments are required and can be made beginning Monday, January 14 by calling the receptionist at 775-883-0703 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.





Manzanar submitted by Betty Johnson

1929 *was not the best of years.* The whole country was in a deep depression and the poor souls who lived on the dust bowl prairies packed up and headed for the far west. All of southern California was growing rapidly. Mr. Mulholland had been buying up water rights wherever he found them and the Owens Valley was his Eureka. Los Angeles was thirsty. My dad found employment with Los Angeles county and was sent to Manzanar. We were there 4 years. I was 5 when we arrived and remember those years among the happiest of my childhood.

The town was small and getting smaller. There had once been two schools but when we arrived there was only one school for grades kindergarten to twelve. The schoolhouse actually had two rooms but one was empty and we would play games or roller skate there. My mother was our teacher. My classes ended before her day was done, so I would amble home enjoying the scenery and play with friends. One day a man stopped me to ask where someone lived and I knew just what to do. Having been taught the stranger danger lesson, I started screaming, "a man's trying to steal me, a man's trying to steal me!" as my little legs churned toward the school house. Of course, the man was a friend of my dad's, but I was traumatized, so mom put her class on the honor system and drove me home. It would be interesting to know how that worked out.

In the spring, my friends and I would watch as the horse drawn wagons went up and down the rows spraying the orchards. There were cherries, apricots, pears peaches, nectarines and many famous varieties of apples. Our home was surrounded by the orchards and at blossom time the perfume was intoxicating.

In the fall the pickers arrived, then the packers who graded, boxed and shipped. It was exciting to have so many new people around. They came from everywhere, most were desperate for a job, but they left again before we knew them well.

Behind us, reaching over 14 thousand feet, was the second tallest mountain in the Sierras. Mt. Williams let us dream of heights to reach and we hiked and rode our horses toward her in a futile effort to scale her. She had streams rolling down toward us where we could float little pieces of wood and pretend they were boats and see whose got entangled beyond retrieval first. The elk and the deer called her home in the summer and came down in the fall to overwinter and eat as much fruit as they could hold.

Shepherds came through with their flocks. We could hear the tinkle of bells as they slowly ate their way past. One day while playing, my friend Lamoine and I heard the sound of the bells, like enticing sirens calling, and we followed the sheep, their herder, and the dogs on their way. We followed for about a mile before our parents found us. We were in deep trouble! Mom said I had walked so far, she supposed I must be very tired, so maybe I should go right up to bed without dinner. Gazing out of my bed room window, feeling sorry for myself, I could see Lamoine playing. "What happened"? "I got a spanking". "Mom," I called, "can I have a spanking so I can go out and play"?

Los Angeles grew more and more thirsty and started using the water rights from the ranchers. It was a move that boarded on criminal and is very well chronicled. The result was the water was increasingly sent south. Owens Lake went dry and as the trees died of thirst, the ranchers lost everything. The desert had reclaimed itself and there it sat until 1942 when it was used, infamously, by the Federal Government as a Japanese interment camp. Today there is a museum in Manzanar you may visit for their history.
