DIABETES AWARENESS MONTH: TAKING ACTION

November is officially designated as Diabetes Awareness Month in the United States. November 14 is celebrated as World Diabetes Day to honor Sir Frederick Banting (his birthday), who co-discovered insulin with Charles Best in 1922, saving millions of lives. At Carson Tahoe Diabetes and Nutrition Outpatient Department, we dedicate this month to celebrating our mission to support and increase awareness to those in our community who have been diagnosed with diabetes and prediabetes. Early detection and inspired management can reduce complications associated with diabetes and improve overall quality of life.

Diabetes is a disease that affects 1 in 7 adults in this country. Type 2 diabetes affects around 90% of those diagnosed with diabetes and is characterized as insulin resistance. Insulin is the key that unlocks the door to the cell and allows glucose to enter and be used as energy. In the case of Type 2 diabetes, this process stops working effectively and as glucose rises in the blood stream. Over time, this can lead to damage to the heart, kidneys, eyes, and nerves. Type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune condition where there is no insulin production at all, and insulin injections are necessary for life.

Lifestyle changes are important to the management of diabetes. Nutrition, activity and movement, sleep and stress management are key factors that need to be considered and addressed when working with people with diabetes. Through Carson Tahoe Health, our diabetes educators can offer individualized sessions, group classes and monthly support groups in both Carson City and Dayton.

Diabetes Awareness Month is a reminder to people with diabetes that they are not alone. Support is essential and

with advances in technology such as continuous glucose monitors and insulin pumps, education can reinforce confidence in management. This month also calls awareness to prediabetes, the stage where insulin resistance is beginning but has not yet reached a critical stage. Getting tested can lead to early lifestyle changes that may prevent diabetes from progressing.

Finally, this month is a time for hope. Research continues and is moving forward, offering better treatments and tools to ease the challenges in management.

Please join us on November 8, from 9am-12pm, at Carson Tahoe Hospital for a Diabetes Health fair. Local endocrinologists will be providing short, educational sessions and there will be a variety of staff and vendors providing additional information and engaging ideas on diabetes management.
